

Good Neighbor Plus Program Cool Season Turf

- ◆ Good Neighbor Round One – *Late January through February*
 - Our first visit promotes control of existing winter annual weeds and enhances lawn color. Application consists of pre-emerge weed control for broadleaf weeds as well as a light fertilizer to help give a greener turf.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Two - *March through April*
 - Our second application contains post-emerge weed control. This lawn care application controls broadleaf weeds throughout the lawn.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Three – *Mid-March through April*
 - Our third visit promotes continued control of existing annual weeds, additionally we will be applying pre-emerge weed control for broadleaf weeds and a slow release fertilizer that will help keep the lawn green throughout the warmer months.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Four – *May through June*
 - Our fourth round is especially important because we apply a lawn fungicide to control lawn diseases such as brown patch and dollar spot. Included in this treatment is additional weed control.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Five – *Mid June through July*
 - The fifth round continues our preventative treatment of lawn diseases such as brown patch and dollar spot. Included in this treatment is additional weed control and nutsedge control.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Six – *Mid July through Mid August*
 - The sixth round concludes our preventative treatment of lawn diseases such as brown patch and dollar spot. We also include in this treatment an additional weed control and nutsedge control.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Seven - *Mid August through September*
 - Round seven is important for the continued growth and color of your cool season turf. On this round we apply a complete fertilizer coupled with Humate. As a chelating agent, Humate helps release the tied up nutrients from the soil. When Humate is applied, less fertilizer and less water are needed. It also improves overall plant health.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Eight - *Mid September through October*
 - Round eight completes our fall application of fertilizer and continues our treatment of post-emerge broadleaf and grassy weeds.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Nine - *Mid October through November*
 - During this round we help prepare your lawn for winter by applying post-emerge weed control to control the last remaining summer and fall weeds.
- ◆ Good Neighbor Round Ten - *Mid November through December*
 - Round ten is our final round of the year and we apply post-emerge weed control to help control winter annuals, so that your turf will fill in early in the spring.
